What is Cotillion?

Cotillion has been around since the early 1800's. Today Cotillions are present in many cities. Cotillion is considered by many, to be a part of a child's social education. Boise Cotillion will offer dance instruction and exposure to proper social etiquette, in a fun, age appropriate party atmosphere. Children will gain an appreciation of the joy of a variety of music and dance, as well as practice good manners and gracious behavior. Each party/lesson will offer instruction in traditional social dances as well as popular favorites. Partners are arranged, and change often. Each child will have approximately eight different partners per night. Emphasis will be placed on proper social etiquette and fun. Good manners are for everyone.

Through instruction and practice, good manners become second nature, and children gain confidence and poise because they know how to handle themselves in a variety of social situations. They have fun with their friends, meet new friends from throughout the city, dance, win prizes and enjoy refreshments, while learning social etiquette that will contribute to future success. The parties will be strictly supervised by a combination of the Cotillion director, dance instructor, paid assistants and parent chaperones. Appropriate behavior is required of all Cotillion members.

Cotillion Dress

Young ladies shall wear a party dress and appropriate party dancing shoes, no atheletic or sneakers and the heels (max 1 1/2" heel) appropriate for age and dancing. Flats and low heels are best. Cotillion dress is on the conservative side. Please, no strapless, backless, midriff or dresses that are too revealing. Short white gloves are required.

Gentlemen shall wear a suit or sports coat (blazer and khakis) tie, dark socks, and dark shoes that are leather type tie or loafer, no athletic shoes. Theme dances, the dress should be appropriate to theme or Cotillion wear.

Cotillion is inclusive and respectful of differences, please note the above dress standards are required of all.
